



Exploitation

Exploitation refers to where an individual or group takes advantage of an imbalance of power to coerce, manipulate or deceive an adult in exchange for something. It can take many forms including sexual, financial and criminal exploitation. Those working in social care have a responsibility to safeguard adults from exploitation.
